New road layout at the entrance to Newham

I am contacting you on behalf of the Newham business community who have been in touch with the Newham BID Manager, Mel Richardson to highlight their concerns around the new road junction layouts following Aldi's arrival on Newham Road.

Firstly, Newham businesses welcomes Aldi to the entrance of our industrial estate and along with Tesco, they both provide a good service to our Newham businesses and employees and of course, residents of Truro.

However, highways provision for pedestrian access between the two stores and the reconfiguration of the road to allow a right hand turn into Aldi have created obstacles and safety issues for our Newham businesses.

What's more we are disappointed that there was no consultation undertaken with Newham businesses who are already in situ to consider a solution that respects the current businesses and provides a safe and integrated solution for Aldi. This could have easily been achieved through Newham BID's comprehensive database of 150 businesses on the estate and via Truro BID's relationship with Tesco.

I gather Tesco had not been consulted either before or during the building of the pedestrian 'safe refuge' or the new lane arrangements which have impacted their business. I will leave them to make their own representations if they wish to around the safety of the new lane that was altered last Friday.

To deal with the 'safe pedestrian refuge' first, Newham BID only found out about this when Macsalvors got in touch. The issue with what is essentially a raised kerb and a couple of bollards placed in the centre of the road, is that it makes access more difficult for large vehicles to navigate the gap; cranes, car transporters, Biffa lorries, First coaches, HGVs and many other heavy and wide traffic need to access the far end of Newham. We are after all, an industrial estate. I have attached the specifications from the fleet of vehicles used by Macsalvors for reference.

Whilst it may be possible to pass between the kerbs with most vehicles' wheelbase, there is a risk to pedestrians waiting to cross in the centre of the refuge given the height of wing mirrors from these large vehicles and the likelihood of overhang from the loads they carry. This means in effect that the 'safe' pedestrian refuge is not safe.

We would ask that you reconsider this arrangement from a safety and vehicle user perspective and look at a pelican crossing with no central reservation or a zebra which would be more appropriate for this heavy traffic area.

To deal with the revised layout, whilst we note that, a shorter lane was put in place for Tesco traffic last week making it clearer that traffic continuing to Newham stays in the middle lane, the new right hand turn to Aldi means that the Newham traffic and Tesco traffic have to temporarily join the same lane; it is not until the last minute, that motorists are able to signal either to enter Tesco or to continue onto Newham by which time anyone

leaving Tesco and turning right out of the store, makes a judgement about where the vehicle is heading. Potentially, this is a very dangerous situation, especially if there is heavy traffic coming in either direction. We have already been made aware of one collision resulting in a write off for the business of one of their vans and several near misses.

On top of that, if you watch for long enough, traffic is leaving Aldi and turning across the road into Tesco on a frequent basis; presumably customers are checking out stock and price comparisons in both stores. This adds to the highways risk as these motorists are moving across lanes very quickly but without gaining the speed necessary to make a smooth transition given the other vehicle flows.

We accept that there is probably no easy solution to the road layout but would ask that you monitor this very carefully, consult with relevant businesses and be open to making any necessary changes to allow everyone to co-exist as safely as possible.

Overall, Newham BID Committee, supported by many businesses, feel that the proposals have not been thought through or considered with the multiple vehicle users that Newham serves. Given that this is not the first time that highways have undergone developments on Newham without any consultation or even, communication (referring now to the recent destruction of the Newham planted area just past Aldi when a new sub-station was installed) we would very much appreciate your assurance that we can be consulted on any future developments.

We would be more than happy to coordinate any consultation process or host a meeting of interested businesses, show you around our vibrant industrial estate and generally work with you to get the best infrastructure solutions in place.

We would be interested in your response to this letter and what action you are prepared to consider implementing to create a safer environment for all. Happy to discuss in person on site.

'I had a near miss myself on Wednesday when a car pulled out in front of me from Tesco when I was coming into Newham, it will only get worse!'

'One of our vans are written off at the Tesco junction last week where my guys were returning to site and someone pulled into the side of them as they assumed they were going to turn into Tesco store'
