Newham BID is a business-led initiative to improve the trading environment of businesses and social enterprises within Newham & The Port of Truro. A committee of volunteers drawn from the organisations that pay the levy meet regularly to oversee the delivery of the business plan which identifies how the funds are spent in line with business priorities under four key themes.

## Thank you in difficult times

Newham BID is in year three of its second five-year term which started on 1st September 2018 following a strong mandate from businesses during a ballot; 86% of those who voted supported the BID's renewal.

Thank you to all businesses in Newham for their continued support and optimism during the last two challenging years. A warm welcome to new businesses who have chosen to relocate to Newham and be part of our valuable business community.

# Some of our BID activities during the last 12 months:

## 1. Enhancing the Environment

- Maintaining signage across Newham and keeping slats updated as businesses change.
- Keeping Newham tidy through our maintenance contract with Truro City Council and by working with Cornwall Council and their contractors, Biffa.
- Organising a litter pick in association with Truro BID with Newham businesses volunteering their staff time.
- Landscaping the area at the entrance to Newham, providing a more attractive entrance to the estate.

#### 2. Place and Business Promotion

 Keeping a high profile for Newham and its businesses through PR and Marketing activities including website and videos. To see our West Briton features, go to: www.newhamtruro.co.uk/news

#### 3. Safety and Security

- Helping to **detect and deter crime** through the maintenance of **CCTV cameras** (32 in total) including 3 ANPR (vehicle recognition cameras) and 3 infrared zoom lens cameras to provide facial recognition in poor lighting. The CCTV software has been upgraded in February 2022 to improve functionality together with a new agreement to ensure footage can be downloaded within 48 hours.
- Providing additional security and peace of mind through Kestrel Security Guards, patrolling Newham more frequently since the pandemic. Businesses who need Kestrel urgently should call their 24-hour control room on 02380 666760 and quote the Newham site reference number of CM505.

#### 4. Creating Connections

- Supporting businesses throughout the pandemic Newham BID has provided free sanitiser and regular updates on grants available alongside other support and advice.
- Representing the interests of businesses including solving issues around poor drainage, pot-holes and anti-social behaviour. During 2021/22 the flooding issues along Newham Road have been resolved through liaison with Cormac and South West Water and Newham BID worked closely and sensitively with the statutory agencies to handle fly-tipping and tent encampments. During January 2022, Newham BID liaised between levy payers, Western Power and their contractors to mitigate the impacts of the power outages.

## Newham News

The business plan which was put together following extensive consultation with Newham businesses delivers projects and services under **four key themes**.



• Publishing a new edition of the pocket-sized map/directory listing every business on Newham, distributed across Newham in October 2021.



- Representing Newham on the Truro Towns Fund Board overseeing the City's £23.6million award to deliver transformational projects across Truro including safer and more connected walkways and cycle paths and a bridge across the river from Newham to Boscawen Park, the site of a proposed Sport and Recreation Hub. - Hosted visit by Cherilyn Mackrory MP to Newham in Summer 2021. Cherilyn met a number of business owners to hear about their business successes, issues and challenges. The need for the road to be widened between Gas Hill and Lighterage Hill was also raised and subsequently, Cornwall Council is revising the feasibility study with a view to this being considered alongside access proposals as part of the Truro Town Deal.

## What's Next - More information will be coming soon

- Newham BID has appointed landscape architects, Meiloci to create an exciting landscape strategy including planting, art and sculpture using recyclable materials from businesses on Newham. Following the landscaping at the entrance to Newham, the verge adjacent to Skinners will be planted next. Other ideas for implementation across the estate include the installation of bug hotels, outdoor seating and vegetable/herb plots where Newham employees can grow produce. It is also hoped to install beehives with a view to having 'Newham honey' in the future.
- Newham BID will be looking at how it can do more to create a 'green' industrial estate, supporting businesses to reduce their carbon footprint.

# **Summary of BID Financial Arrangements**

In the third year of the second term of Newham BID, Cornwall Council, the billing authority was due to collect levy payments totalling £76,316 from 143 levy payers that have operated in the BID during 2021/22. By 1st March 2022, 98% of the annual levy had been collected providing £75,050 at Newham BIDs disposal for the twelve-month period with the remaining levy pledged to be paid shortly.
